Program Tiers

There are two program tiers. If invited to apply, both tiers will go through an entrance interview process. If accepted, students will fall into one of the two below:

Leadership Elite

Will apply to incoming freshman and possibly sophomores/juniors who **are able to fit the classes into their schedules.**

Students must maintain a GPA of 2.75 on the 4.0 scale. They will complete Leadership courses. They will complete community service hours, a senior project, attend monthly business meetings and will earn graduation regalia and a letter jacket.

Leadership Foundations

Will apply to any existing student **who cannot fit the classes** into their schedules. They must maintain 2.75 GPA on the 4.0 scale. They will complete community service hours and attend our monthly business meeting. They will earn different graduation regalia from the Elite tier.

A few of the opportunities our leadership students have are to meet and visit with local and state political leaders, tours of the State Capital, team building field trips and College Visits. There are numerous community service projects to participate in as well.

 - GPA of 2.75 (Must attach recent report card).
 - Interview with Leadership Academy
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- Acceptance to the Academy Permits a transfer to Ellison High School (Transportation is not provided).
 - Nominations may come from current members, peers, teachers, or yourself.
 - Applications open every year, see your counselor.
 - Students should be academically motivated to pursue Honors, AP, or dual credit courses.
 - Applicants should show involvement in one or more organizations(student council, band, choir, athletics, FFA, or others).
 - Must be willing to serve others though volunteer work and community involvement.
