- Work on applications for admission to colleges that you are considering. Do not forget to request an official transcript from the registrar's office for each college to which you are applying.
- Explore financial aid at your selected colleges.
- Apply for all **scholarships** applicable to your situation. (All transcripts for scholarship applications are free.)
- Watch out for **financial aid scams**! You are advised not to pay for any financial aid or scholarship information.
- **Don't procrastinate**! Remember to meet deadlines for applications and scholarships.

Not doing so could cost you a scholarship or deny your entry to the college of your choice. United States Senate Youth Program (USSYP)

The United States Senate Youth Program, established in 1962 by U.S. Senate Resolution, is a unique educational experience for outstanding high school students interested in pursuing careers in public service. The 57^{th} annual program will be held in Washington, D.C., from March 2 – 9, 2019.

Two student leaders from each state, the District of Columbia and the Department of Defense Education Activity will spend a week in Washington experiencing their national government in action. Student delegates will hear major policy addresses by senators, cabinet members, officials from the Departments of State and Defense and directors of other federal agencies, as well as participate in meetings with the president and a justice of the U.S. Supreme Court. All transportation, hotel, and meal expense will be provided by The Hearst Foundations (https://www.hearstfdn.org/)

Each delegate is also awarded a \$10,000 undergraduate college scholarship, with encouragement to pursue coursework in history and political science. Horatio Alger Association Scholarship

Deadline: October 25, 2018

- Be enrolled full time as a high school senior in the United States; be progressing normally toward graduation in spring/summer 2018 with plan to enter a college in the United States no later than the fall following graduation.
- Exhibit a strong commitment to pursue and complete a bachelor's degree at an accredited non-profit public or private institution in the United States (students may start their studies at a two-year institution and then transfer to a four-year institution)
- Demonstrate critical financial need (\$55,000 or lower adjusted gross family income is required)
- Be involved in extracurricular and community service activities
- Display integrity and perseverance in overcoming adversity.
- Maintain a minimum grade point average (GPA) of 2.0 and
- Be a United States citizen

Americanism Essay Contest

Deadline: December 01, 2018

- Grade 7 12
- Must be sponsored by a branch of the Fleet Reserve Association or a unit of the Ladies Auxiliary, or FRA Member-at-large
- The essay shall be on the theme: What Patriotism Mean to Me and shall not exceed 350 words
- The essay shall be legibly written or typed on one side of paper
- The title of the essay shall be written or typed at the top of the paper.
- A student may submit one entry each year
- Each entry must be accompanied by a separate sheet stating: the entrants name, address, zip code, telephone number, school grade (or equivalent), name of school, or the words "home schooled", number of words in essay, and the sponsoring branch/unit or sponsor's name.
- Entries submitted to branches shall be submitted to the Branch Americanism-Patriotism Committee and postmarked no later than December 1, for judging at the branch level.

The Coca-Cola Scholars Program Scholarship

Deadline: October 31, 2018

Applicants must be:

The Coca-Cola Scholars Program Scholarship is an achievement-based scholarship award to graduating high school seniors. Students are recognized for their capacity to lead and serve, as well as their commitment to making a significant impact on their school and communities.

- Current high school or home-schooled student attending a school in the U.S. or select Department of Defense School who will graduate during the 2018-2019 academic year.
- U.S. Citizen, U.S. Nationals, U.S. Permanent resident, Refugees, Asylees, Cuban-Haitian Entrants, or Humanitarian Parolees-based on the guidelines utilized by the U.S. Department of Education for Federal Financial Aid eligibility
- Will receive a high school diploma during the current academic year
- Planning to pursue a degree at an accredited U.S. post-secondary institution

Applicants may not be:

Children or grandchildren of employees, officers, or owners of Coca-Cola bottling companies, The Coca-Cola Company, Company divisions or subsidiaries.

- International students with the exception of students at DoD schools
- High School graduates
- Or Temporary Residents of the United States

Wendy's Heisman Scholarship

Deadline: October 17, 2018

- Students whose senior year of high school is the 2018-2019 academic year, graduating with the class of 2019.
- Student who have at least a "B" grade average (3.0) GPA during grades 9, 10, and 11.
- Students who participate in at least one of 47 Wendy's High School recognized sports recognized by the International Olympic Committee or the National Federation of State High School Associations.
- Students who have participated in volunteer service, community. Involvement or leadership within his/her school or community.

Military Order of the Purple Heart Auxiliary Unit 1876-Ron Taylor Scholarship

Deadline: October 25, 2018

- The spouse, direct lineal descendent (child, step-child, adopted child or grandchild) of a Purple Heart recipient who is a member of Chapter 1876 or MOPHA Unit 1876.
- The widow/widower of a service member killed-in-action or who died of wounds. Supporting documentation and evidence must be included with the application.
- If the applicant (widow, widower or direct lineal descendent) is not a member of MOPHA Unit 1876 or CENTEX Chapter 1876, they may become a member by contacting the scholarship chairperson via email: drswllms62@gmail.com (with the Subject: Ron Taylor Scholarship Application, Member Application) to receive an application. Verification (DD 214 or copy of orders) of eligibility must be submitted along with membership application.
- Must NOT be receiving post 9/11 or Forever GI Bill benefits.

In order to be eligible to receive the MOPHA Ron Taylor Scholarship, applicants must meet the following three requirements:

- A graduate or upcoming graduate (current senior) of a high school or GED program.
- Accepted by or enrolled as a full-time or part-time undergraduate student at an accredited U.S. college, university or trade school at the time the scholarship is awarded.
- Able to demonstrate the capacity for advanced academic achievement or technical proficiency as demonstrated by maintaining at least 2.0 cumulative grade point average (GPA) based on an unweighted 4.0 grading system.

To apply, applicants need to complete and submit the following materials:

- MOPHA Scholarship Application Form
- Original, official high school and/or college transcript through the latest completed semester or quarter.
- Essay of 300 words on the following subject "How Has Social Media Impacted Our Society Today?
- One letter of recommendation from someone other than a family member
- Copy of ID card
- All applications must be mailed in hard copy to the address indicated at the top of the application packet.

Prudential Spirit of Community Awards

Deadline: November 06, 2018

- Grades 5-12 as of November 06, 2018, and is a legal resident of the 50 states or the District of Columbia
- Engaged in a volunteer activity that occurred at least in part after September 01, 2017
- Completes application and submits it to a school principal or the head of an officially designated local organization by November 06, 2018

NAACP Scholarship

Deadline: January 19, 2018

- Plan to attend college in the fall semester 2018
- Complete application in its entirety and include signature on the specified line
- Compose a 300 word essay on one of the following topics: What are your career goals? Explain. OR
 Who has influenced you the most throughout your life and why?
- Submit an official transcript
