### **Communication About Student Learning**

Liberty Hill Middle School is committed to frequent two-way communication with families about their children's learning. Some of the ways that we communicate include:

- Use of Blackboard (allows for emails, calls and text messaging)
- Parent-teacher conferences
- Progress reports (3<sup>rd</sup> and 6<sup>th</sup> week of the nine weeks) and report cards (at the end of each nine weeks)

- 2. By June 2025, 100% of 6th-8th grade students will achieve Meets Grade Level or higher on Interim STAAR Math exams.
- By June 2025, 100% of students tested will achieve Meets Grade Level or higher on the Algebra I EOC.
