# **College Entrance Exams 2019-2020**

All colleges require some sort of entrance exam in order to be accepted and the scores are usually valid for 5 years. Four-year universities require either the SAT or the ACT but sometimes ask student to also take TSI. Community colleges accept the TSI Assessment, but a student might be exempt based on their SAT or ACT scores. For example, CTC will exempt a student from one or more TSI requirements if:

- SAT (March 2016+) math score is at least 530 exempt from TSI math exam
- SAT (March 2016+) Evidence Based Reading & Writing score is at least 480 exempt from TSI reading section
- ACT score is at least 23 and a math score is at least 19 exempt from TSI math exam
- ACT score is at least 23 and an English score is at least 19 exempt from TSI reading section

# **SAT**

**Register:** Online at www.collegeboard.org Deadline is usually about 4 weeks prior to testing date (upload photo)

You can have your scores sent to up to 8 colleges for free (4 with registration & 4 additional).

Cost: \$64.50 (with Essay) Online registration requires credit card payment or fee waiver; check/money order fill out

paper registration form. If on free/reduced lunch, see home campus counselor for a fee waiver code - limit 2

(once in 11th and once in 12th) & get 4 college application fee waivers sent to you

**Late Fee:** Additional \$29.00 (can use fee waiver for late registration)

Accommodations: After approved for test accommodations, provide SSD Number from College Board's Eligibility Letter

Score Reports: To send colleges your report for free, you must do so within 9 days after taking the test - limit 4

**Evaluates:** General thinking and problem-solving abilities

Focus: Real-world learning and analysis and what students learn in school; heavy on vocabulary

Bring: Calculator

Length of time: 3 hours for exam plus 50 minutes for essay

**2016+ Sections:** Three sections (total of 154 questions excluding the essay):

- Math (80 minutes for 58 questions more algebra & problem solving; limited use of calculator)
- Evidence-Based Reading (65 minutes for 52 questions)
- Evidence-Based Writing (35 minutes for 44 questions)
- Essay (<u>take it</u> because most colleges require it) student reads a 650-750 passage and prepares a "facts-based essay" (similar to AP exam questions)

**2016+ Scoring:** Reverts to 1600-point scale with Math & EBRW score each ranging from 200-800. Will also show TOTAL SCORE. No penalty for wrong answers.

Additional scoring:

- 3 test scores (10-40) on Reading, Writing/Language, & Math;
- 2 cross-test scores (10-40) on Science & Social Studies;
- 7 subscores (1-15) on Relevant Words in Context, Command of Evidence, Expression of Ideas, Standard English Conversions, Heart of Algebra, Passport to Advanced Math, Problem Solving and Data Analysis;
- 3 essay subscores (2-8) on Essay Reading, Essay Analysis, & Essay Writing.

### **ACT**

**Register:** Online at www.actstudent.org Deadline is usually about 4 weeks prior to testing date (upload photo)

You can have your scores sent to up to 4 colleges for free through the registration process.

Cost: \$67.00 (with Writing section) If you are on free/reduced lunch, see your counselor for a fee waiver code (limit 2).

**Late Fee:** Additional \$30.00 (CANNOT use fee waiver for late registration fee)

**Evaluates:** Overall educational development and ability to complete college-level work

**Focus:** Heavy on grammar and punctuation

**Length of time:** 2 hours and 55 minutes (not including breaks or the optional 40 minute essay) **Sections:**Four sections (215 questions) excluding the optional essay that you should do):

English (24 minutes for 75 questions)
Reading (35 minutes for 40 questions)

Math (60 minutes for 60 questions)
Science (35 minutes for 40 questions)

New Fall 2015: Enhanced writing test, new scoring for STEM, Career Readiness Indicator, Test Complexity Indicator, ELA Score

**Format:** 215 questions – all multiple-choice

**Scoring:** Each test score ranges from 1 to 36 (No penalty for wrong answers)

Composite Score is figured by adding the four sections and dividing by 4 (this is what colleges are looking for)

## **TSI Assessment**

**Length of time:** Allow at least 4 hours (it is untimed, but students have been known to take up to 6 hours to complete)

Sections: Math (elementary and intermediate algebra & functions, geometry and measurements, data analysis, statistics & probability)

Reading (literacy analysis, main idea and supporting details, inferences in text, author's use of language)

Writing w/ Essay (essay revision, agreement, sentence structure, sentence logic)

**Format:** Must complete Pre-Assessment Activities **before** you can begin the test

i. CTC's Pre-Assessment – go to www.ctcd.edu and type in "PAA" in the Search Box, and click "Pre-Assessment Activity – Central Texas College" and go through each of the 5 links.

ii. TC's Pre-Assessment – go to www.templejc.edu click on "Resources" click on "Testing Center", then click "College Placement & Program Admissions Testing"

You can still enroll in a community college if you score below this, but you may be require to take some developmental classes and it may prevent you from getting accepted into certain programs (i.e. Nursing).

**Register:** Check with your home campus by talking to your counselor because each campus does it differently.

**Cost:** Free on KISD campus (limit 2 attempts per yr). The Career Center will only test CCALL students who plan to attend CTC.

You can also take it at CTC's Testing Center, but follow these directions:

**Bring:** Student ID # & valid photo ID (DO NOT bring anything else with you)

Cost: \$25 (includes Writing) Prepay at CTC's Business Office if you don't have exact cash (Bldg 119)

Take receipt to Testing Services (Bldg 111, Rm 233). Below are the Testing Services' hours:

Hours: Mon-Thurs 7:30 a.m. – 7:00 p.m. Friday 7:30 a.m. – 2:00 p.m. Saturday 9:00 a.m. – 2:00 p.m.
